



### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Orygen Specialist Program (OSP), a program of the Royal Melbourne Hospital, provides specialist mental health services for young people aged 12 to 25 and focuses on providing early intervention to young people with severe and complex mental illness. OSP also works alongside Orygen, the National Centre of Excellence in Youth Mental Health which operates four primary mental health care headspace services in the catchment area. Victoria's Mental Health Services are undergoing generational system reform to enable better service delivery and outcomes for all Victorians. Youth Mental Health Services are being reformed in this process.

Multidisciplinary teams deliver individually tailored services that comprise assessment and crisis intervention, case management, medication, psychotherapy, family support, inpatient care, group work, vocational support, educational assistance, and intensive outreach. Specialist clinical streams offer targeted interventions for psychotic disorders (including young people at 'ultra-high risk' of psychosis), mood disorders, and personality disorders; and manage co-morbid substance use disorders, eating disorders, and neurodevelopment disorders. A forensic stream has also now been established providing in custodial and community justice services. Streams are supported by the Psychosocial Recovery program, Community Development program, and Orygen Training Team. Orygen also has a 19-bed Inpatient Unit, 15-bed Orygen @ Home program, Youth Access Team and emerging HOPE and YPARC programs making up the acute and sub-acute care sector. Orygen highly values responsive services for youth in the western and northwestern region of Melbourne. Orygen programs are to be guided by evidence-based, culturally-safe and trauma-informed principles incorporating the diverse needs of all young people and families. This is especially important for those from LGBTQI+, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, and culturally and linguistically diverse populations. Responsive and inclusive practices are at the forefront of all Orygen care.







### **DEPARTMENT DESCRIPTION**

The Hospital Post Suicide Engagement service (HOPE) is an aftercare service initiative based on the recommendations from the 2019 Royal Commission into Victorian Mental Health Services. The service has been codesigned with a lived experience workforce with the aims to provide intensive and targeted wrap around supports to young people aged 12 to 25 years who have presented to an emergency department due to an acute onset of deliberate self-harm, suicidal thoughts and/or suicide attempt(s).

HOPE services provide clinical, lived experience and psychosocial supports to eligible young people and their support network for a 3-month period. Contact with eligible young people occurs within 24-hours of referral and focus of care targets stressors that may have contributed to the person considering/attempting suicide and/or deliberate self-harm. The service forms part of the front-end access to Orygen and will partner with specialist and primary care services.

The service operates over a number of sites and staff may be required to work from Parkville, Footscray, Wyndham, Sunshine, Melton, or other sites within the catchment.

### **POSITION SUMMARY**

The OSP HOPE Mental Health Clinician provides comprehensive crisis support, care coordination and brief psychological interventions to young people and families/carers. Young people engaging with HOPE will be experiencing suicide attempts, suicidal ideation, and deliberate self-harm and may also present with a range of co-morbid mental health and wellbeing issues.

The Mental Health Clinician works within a specialist multidisciplinary team environment and is responsible for devising, implementing and evaluating an appropriate treatment plan for each young person and their family/carers. This involves provision of highly skilled clinical assessments, psychological interventions, homebased assertive outreach to facilitate engagement and brief intervention tasks, such as liaison with other agencies and advocacy on behalf of the young person.

The Mental Health Clinician will function autonomously, carry a caseload of young people, participate in clinical review meetings and practice according to the philosophy and protocols of the service.

### **KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES**

- Manage and undertake mental health and risk assessment, psychological treatment, crisis intervention, family work and systems containment, for the young people/families/carers/system
- Timely completion of mental health assessments including formulation, individual service plans, crisis management plans, outcome measures, documentation of young people's progress in client files, discharge summaries and contact sheets
- Provide high-quality clinical care based on clinical experience working with young people with serious mental illness
- Work within a multidisciplinary team partnering with management, medical, clinical, lived experience and administrative workforce
- Provision of brief case management or family work to selected clients and associated documentation
- Attendance at clinical review meetings

- Support and participate in the Health Services Occupational Health & Safety (OHS) Policies and Procedures and implement (where appropriate) at unit/service area level including reporting any incidents of unsafe work practices, sites/areas or equipment
- Comply with Safety & Service Improvement / Quality Management policies and procedures
- Participation in formal performance and annual discussion review processes
- Participate in ongoing service improvement and professional development initiatives and activities
- · Contribute to organisation-wide and service/division initiatives and planning activities
- Successful completion of required mandatory training activities, including training related to the National Standards
- Operate within the legal frameworks e.g., Mental Health Act and Privacy Act.







- Contributes to the timely and effective management of Compliance with Health Service and Divisional critical incidents and emergency situations, including team and individual debriefing processes
- Ensure high standards of clinical care that are congruent with Orygen's aims - client focused, accessible, responsive and consistent with best practice
- Capacity to provide, or develop skills in, integrated assessment, treatment and care for clients with significant risk and/or comorbidity
- Manage clinical risk and actively work toward implementing risk reduction strategies
- Establish and maintain effective interfaces and partnerships with key agencies and community groups through consultation, liaison, education and collaborative projects: including Drug and Alcohol services, Youth Justice, Disability and primary care providers etc.

### **Formal Qualifications:**

Occupational Therapists:

 Registration under the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act (2009) with the Occupational Therapy Board of Australia.







 An approved Degree from a recognised school of Occupational Therapy or other qualifications approved for eligibility for membership of the Australian Association of Occupational Therapy (Vic.).

### Social Workers:

 An approved degree in Social Work and eligibility for membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers.

### Registered Psychiatric Nurses:

- Registration as a registered nurse under the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act (2009) with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.
- Bachelor Degree in Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing or equivalent, or, Bachelor Degree in Nursing plus a Postgraduate qualification in Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing.

### Psychologists:

Registration as a Psychologist under the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act (2009) with practice endorsement as a Clinical, Forensic or Clinical Neuro Psychologist with the Psychology Board of Australia (or eligibility to enter a registrar program as a clinical, forensic or clinical neuro psychologist with the Psychology Board of Australia where relevant).

### **Essential:**

- A minimum of 12-24 months' experience in clinical practice within the mental health field, including young people experiencing mental health disorders.
- Demonstrated experience in providing case management.
- Ability to develop, implement and evaluate client-centred individual service plans, risk assessments and diagnostic formulations.
- Demonstrated commitment to the recovery approach in mental health treatment and support, with a focus on working collaboratively with consumers and families/carers to promote self-determination and enable progress towards reaching consumers personal recovery goals.
- · Ability to develop effective working relationships, collaborations and partnerships with a range of services within the broader community service system including primary care, AOD agencies, employment and housing services, and PDRSs.
- Ability to develop, implement and evaluate integrated client-centred individual service plans, risk assessments and diagnostic formulations.
- Ability to work independently and effectively within a multidisciplinary team, with evidence of sound conflict resolution skills.
- Ability to work collaboratively and effectively with young people and their families/carers.
- Well-developed interpersonal and communication skills (written and verbal).
- Knowledge of the rationale and evidence for early intervention in mental illness.
- A commitment to ongoing professional development through access to current literature, continuing education, supervision and attendance at seminars conferences.
- · Comply with all legal requirements pertaining to the position including responsibility for maintaining current registration as required by your professional organisation or other applicable Acts.
- Willingness to work from a community-based site and across multiple sites if required.
- · A Working with Children check.
- A current Victorian driver's licence.


